Father Palman is currently the Parish Priest of Holy Family Parish in Auckland. He has a keen interest in pro-life and pro-family issues and is a courageous proclaimer of the Gospel of Life.

Father Jeremy Palman has learnt, through experience, of the merciful patience of God towards a fragile humanity. Having begun priestly formation at 18 years old (after a radical conversion experience), and leaving a few short weeks later, it took him 17 years to return to the seminary - to what the Lord had in mind all along - to become a diocesan priest for the Auckland Diocese.

In between times, he lived in a religious order in France, living with people off the streets, studied engineering, and worked in product development of farming equipment; and gained valuable experience in other walks of life. He is 50 years old and was ordained in August 2014. Only eight years a priest, and never ceasing to learn, he is currently serving as Parish Priest of Holy Family Parish, Te Atatu Peninsula in Auckland.

Before entering the seminary again in 2008, he was involved in helping young people discover the truth of Saint John Paul II's Theology of the Body and assisted for many years at a young adult summer camp, Hearts Aflame.

Following the truly Catholic mind of Pope Benedict XVI, Father Palman celebrates both Forms of the Roman Rite, where, through the mercy of God, he desires to be an instrument of mercy for Christ's people.
